33rd Sunday after Pentecost Venerable Maximus the Confessor,

January 21st, 2024

Assigned Readings:

Colossians 1:12-18 Matthew 22: 1-14

Saint of the Day:

Saint Maximus the Confessor was born in Constantinople and raised in a pious Christian family. When Saint Maximus entered into government service, he became first secretary and chief counselor to the emperor Heraclius, who was impressed by his knowledge and virtuous life. The Saint soon realized that the emperor and many others had been corrupted by the Monothelite heresy, which was spreading rapidly through the East. He resigned from his duties at court and went to the Chrysopolis monastery, where he received monastic tonsure.

St. Maximus was the greatest defender of Orthodoxy against the heresy of Monothelitism, itself essentially a new version of the earlier Monophysite heresy. He stood in opposition to both the Emperor and the Patriarchs of Constantinople, Antioch, and Alexandria who at various times during the controversy each supported the heretical view. Despite the pressure placed upon him Maximus was unafraid and persevered to the end in proving that there are in the Lord two wills and two natures.

By the Saint's efforts, one Council in Carthage and one in Rome stood firm, and both councils anathematized the false teaching. His sufferings for the sake of the true faith were great: afflicted by hierarchs, beaten by soldiers, imprisoned, and tortured. In the end, he had his tongue cut out and his right hand cut off to prevent him from teaching anymore the true faith, and then was sent into exile to die.

Tone 4 – Troparion of St. Nicholas

Tone 8 – Kontakion of the Resurrection


Tone 6 – Steadfast Protectress
