### Saints of the Day:

The Holy Martyrs Eutropius, Cleonicus and Basiliscus were comrades of St. Theodore the Recruit, or of Tyro. Though arrested alongside him they remained in prison after St. Theodore's martyrdom. When the governor that had arrested the group died suddenly after the execution of St. Theodore the companions remained in prison for some length of time as the interim governor refused to pass sentence on them. When the new governor was formally assigned, he was more inhumane than his predecessor and had the three men brought before him for judgment. The first two were brothers and the third a kinsmen of St. Theodore, all three were young men, and cared for one another as brothers in faith and spirit.

The governor sought first to separate the three men by offering them different bribes and praise, beginning with the two brothers. When he offered them to dine with him on fine foods they refused citing the Psalms, "Blessed is the man who walks not in the counsel of the ungodly." When he offered them large quantities of silver, they reminded him that their Lord was betrayed for wealth in silver and declined. Finally, they told the governor, "As the Holy Trinity is indivisible, so are we indivisible in faith and inseparable in love."

Having failed to separate the young saints he then turned to the old tactics of torture. These attempts were equally of no avail as the saints endured with such peace that the soldiers themselves asked to stop carrying out the punishments ordered. At one point during their struggle the saints received a vision of Jesus Christ in His glory with St. Theodore telling them, "Behold, the Savior has come to help you that you may know life eternal." They were beaten repeatedly and had hot tar poured upon their bodies among other tortures. When it was clear that nothing would dissuade them of the true faith they were ordered to be executed by crucifixion. The saints gave thanks to the Lord Jesus Christ that He would honor them to suffer as He himself had suffered.

The third member of the group Basiliscus was not tortured directly with his compatriots but rather left to watch them suffer. This psychological assault was as useless as every other tactic brought against the saints. He would later be beheaded and is also remembered individually on May  $22^{nd}$ .


